Petitioner prays for grant of regular bail in FIR No.208 dated 12.8.2019 registered under Section.22(c), 27-A of the NDPS Act at Police Station, Rattia, District Fatehabad.

As per the case of the prosecution, Inderjit Singh, a co-accused was found in conscious possession of 960 intoxicating tablets NRX-Tramadol. On his disclosure statement, petitioner is sought to be implicated on the ground that Inderjit Singh purchased the aforesaid intoxicating tablets from the petitioner.

Learned counsel for the petitioner contends that apart from the disclosure statement of Inderjit Singh, no material has been collected against the petitioner.

Learned State counsel is unable to controvert the aforesaid position. However, on instructions from ASI Som Nath, learned State counsel submits that petitioner does not have criminal antecedents.

Without commenting on the merits of the case and keeping in view the aforesaid facts as also the fact that the conclusion of the trial is likely to take some time, it is considered appropriate to release petitioner on regular bail on his furnishing bail bonds and surety bonds to the satisfaction of the concerned Trial Court/Duty Magistrate.

Petition stands allowed.
