[1] Prayer in the writ petition is for the issuance of a writ of mandamus for directing respondent Nos.1 to 3 to take appropriate action against respondent No.4, as also to conduct the enquiry in respect of complaints (Annexure P-2, dated 20.05.2019 & Annexure P-6 dated 24.09.2019) etc.

[2] Learned counsel for the petitioners states that despite communication (Annexure P-5) dated 13.09.2019 from the Assistant Labour Commissioner, Jalandhar to take action regarding complaint No.15654 and send report within 02 weeks, no action has been taken, till date and that in the circumstances, the petitioners would be satisfied, if the writ petition is disposed of by directing the respondents to take action on the complaints (Annexure P-2, dated 20.05.2019 & Annexure P-6 dated 24.09.2019), in accordance with law in a time bound manner.

[3] Notice of motion to respondent Nos.1 to 3 only.

[4] Mr. Rajesh Bhardwaj, learned Senior Deputy Advocate General, Punjab, accepts notice on behalf of respondent Nos.1 to 3 and states that he has no objection to the innocuous prayer of learned counsel for the petitioners.

[5] Without commenting on the merits of the complaints and in view of the statement of learned Senior Deputy Advocate General, Punjab, the writ petition is ***disposed of*** by directing respondent No.3 to consider and decide the claim made in complaints (Annexure P-2 dated 20.05.2019 and Annexure P-6 dated 24.09.2019), in accordance with law within a period of 03 months from the date of receipt of certified copy of this order.
