AVNEESH JHINGAN, J (Oral):

The present Civil Revision Petition has been filed against order dated 24.09.2018 passed by the Additional District Judge (Family Court), Ambala [hereinafter referred to as 'the Family Court'] directing the petitioner to ensure his presence before the U.S. Embassy for signing the documents for the purpose of renewal of Passport of minor child, who is stated to be U.S. Citizen.

[2] The facts in brief are that the petitioner and respondent No.1 got married and were blessed with one male and one female child, one of them being Vandita Nagpal whose date of birth is 13.04.2010. The marriage ran into the troubled waters and resulted into multiple litigations. The present petition is an offshoot from the petition pending for custody of minor

daughter.

[3] During the proceedings, a request was made by respondent No.1 that the minor daughter is studying in Mount Olympus School, Gurugram and a letter issued by the School was relied upon, that there was necessity of renewed Passport for the purpose of proof of her date of birth. The letter has been annexed as Annexure P-4.

[4] At this stage, there is no dispute between the parties that the School is no longer insisting for copy of renewed Passport for the purpose of date of birth as Birth Certificate has already been tendered.

[5] Learned counsel for respondent No.1 argues that there may arise a situation in future where there would be need for renewal of Passport.

[6] In view of the statement made by the parties that letter (Annexure P-4) is no longer insisted by the School, the present Civil Revision Petition is disposed of having rendered infructuous.

[7] Needless to add that in future if an eventuality with regard to renewal of Passport arises, the parties may avail their remedies available in law.
