Present petition under Section 438 Cr.P.C. has been filed for grant of anticipatory bail to the petitioner in Complaint No.1 of 02.07.2018 titled as 'Assistant Director vs. Rajeev Mehan and others' under Sections 3 and 4 of the Prevention of the Money Laundering Act, 2002.

Learned counsel representing the petitioner contended that the petitioner was involved in three complaint cases and he has already been admitted to regular bail in one case and he had also surrendered in all the cases, but his arrest was not shown in the record. Moreso, the petitioner is ready to surrender before learned trial Judge.

Learned counsel representing the respondent-Directorate, contended that petition for anticipatory bail of accused Vinod Kumar Garg

in some other case has been rejected by Hon'ble Apex Court, but the respondent-Directorate has not objection if petitioner surrenders before learned trial Judge.

In view of the above, the present petition is disposed of with direction that the petitioner may surrender before learned trial Judge within a period of 15 days from today. Till the petitioner surrenders before learned trial Judge, interim bail shall remain extended, but it shall be for learned trial Judge to consider the application for regular bail on merit.
