ANIL KSHETARPAL, J.

Petitioner prays for bail in pending trial arising out of FIR No.112 dated 26.06.2018 registered under Sections 302/379-B/34 of the Indian Penal Code at Police Station and under Section 323 IPC (added later on) at Police Station Cantonment, District Amritsar.

As per the allegations of the prosecution, the petitioner along with other co-accused had pushed the scooter on which the deceased along with her daughter were travelling in order to snatch the purse.

Learned counsel for the State, on instructions from ASI Satnam Singh, has submitted that investigations are complete. Police report under Section 173 Cr.P.C. has been filed. Prosecution has examined 3 witnesses out of total 32 witnesses proposed to be examined.

The petitioner is stated to be in custody for a period of 1 year and 5 months approximately. Although, the petitioner is also involved in FIR No.295 dated 24.10.2014 registered under Sections 379/411/420/471 IPC, however, that case is also pending. Co-accused of the petitioner was granted concession of bail vide order dated 03.10.2019 passed in

CRM-M-39098-2019. It would be debatable as to whether offence under Section 302 IPC is made out against the petitioner or not.

Without commenting on the merits of the case and keeping in view the aforesaid facts as also the fact that conclusion of the trial is likely to take time, it is considered appropriate to release the petitioner on regular bail on his furnishing bail bonds/surety bonds to the satisfaction of the concerned trial Court/Duty Magistrate.

Petition stands disposed of.
