Petitioner Jagbir @ Sonu has filed this petition under Section 439 of the Code of Criminal Procedure, 1973 for grant of regular bail in case FIR No.1054 dated 28.11.2017, registered at Police Station Model Town, Panipat, under Sections 302/323/34/435 of the Indian Penal Code.

Notice of motion was issued.

Learned State counsel appeared and contested the instant petition.

I have heard learned counsel for the petitioner as well as learned State counsel and gone through the record.

As submitted by learned State counsel, 11 witnesses have already been recorded including eye-witness Dalbir Singh and he has not supported the prosecution version. He further states that there are disclosure statements made by the co-accused without any recovery in this case to connect the accused with crime.

The petitioner has been in custody since 04.12.2017. He is not

required for any investigation or interrogation purposes as he is in judicial custody. The trial of the case may take long time. No useful purpose will be served by keeping him in custody till the final disposal of the case.

Keeping in view the facts and circumstances of the present case; without discussing the facts in minute detail and without expressing any opinion on the merits of the case, this criminal miscellaneous petition is allowed and the petitioner is ordered to be released on bail subject to his furnishing personal bonds in the sum of ₹50,000/- with one surety in the like amount to the satisfaction of the trial Court/Duty Magistrate.
