The petitioners pray for grant of anticipatory bail in FIR No.07 dated 09.01.2019 under Sections 324, 323, 34 IPC (Section 326 IPC was added later on vide rapat No.20 dated 06.10.2019), registered at Police Station Sadar Faridkot, District Faridkot.

The operative part of the order dated 21.11.2019, vide which the petitioners have been granted interim bail, is reproduced below:

“Learned counsel for the petitioners submits that after registration of the FIR, the parties have compromised the matter and a petition i.e. CRMM-48026-2019, praying for quashing of the FIR, on the basis of compromise, has already been filed by the petitioners.

Notice of motion for 18.12.2019.”

Learned counsel for the petitioners submits that the petitioners, in pursuance to the order dated 21.11.2019, have already appeared before the SHO/Investigating Officer and have joined the investigation.

Learned counsel for the State, on instructions from HC Gurjit

Singh, has not disputed the factual position and submits that the petitioners have joined the investigation and are no more required for any further investigation.

In view of the above, the petition is allowed and the interim bail granted to the petitioners, vide order dated 21.11.2019, is made absolute subject to the conditions envisaged under Section 438(2) Cr.P.C.
