Present petition has been filed under Section 439 Cr.P.C. seeking bail pending trial in case FIR No.269 dated 27.07.2019, under Sections 323, 324, 506, 148 and 149 of the Indian Penal Code (Section 307 of IPC added later on), registered at Police Station Phillaur, District Jalandhar Rural.

Learned counsel for the petitioner contends that the petitioner is in custody since 16.08.2019 and after investigation in the matter report under Section 173 Cr.P.C. has been submitted on 16.11.2019. Further contends the matter has been compromised with the complainant and reference is made to affidavit dated 05.11.2019(P-2). Also contends that there is no other criminal case

pending against the petitioner.

The above factual position is duly acknowledged by learned State counsel on instructions from SI Kulwinder Kumar.

Heard learned counsel for the parties and perused the paper book.

Concededly, after investigation in the matter report under Section 173 Cr.P.C. has been submitted and there is no other criminal case pending against him and the matter has been compromised with the complainant. Thus, trial is likely to take a long time to be concluded and as such no useful purpose would be served by keeping the petitioner behind the bars any more.

In view of the abovesaid circumstances, without expressing any opinion on the merits of the case, this petition is allowed. Petitioner-Sanjoy @ Hunny be admitted to bail on his furnishing bail bonds and surety bonds to the satisfaction of the learned trial Court.

However, it is made clear that above observations may not be construed as an expression of opinion on the merit of the case, including the compromise(P-2) entered into between the parties.
