This writ petition under Articles 226/227 of the Constitution of India has been filed for quashing letter No.267 dated 14.6.2017 (Annexure P-3) whereby respondent No.5 has shown the excess expenditure and also letter No.28.9.2018 (Annexure P-4) issued by respondent No.4.

Learned counsel for the petitioner states that at this stage, he would be satisfied, if a direction is issued to respondent No.2 – Director, Rural Development and Panchayats, Punjab to consider and decide the representation dated 22.11.2018 (Annexure P-5) expeditiously.

Heard.

A complete set of paper book has been handed over to Mr.Vikas Mohan Gupta, Addl.AG, Punjab in the Court today.

In view of the above, without adverting to the merits of the case, the present petition is disposed of with a direction to respondent No.2 – Director, Rural Development and Panchayats, Punjab to consider and

decide the representation dated 22.11.2018 (Annexure P-5) within six weeks from the date of receipt of the certified copy of the judgment. In case, on consideration, the competent authority reaches to the conclusion that the benefit claimed by the petitioner is admissible to her, in such eventuality, the consequential relief be allowed to her, within a period of six weeks thereafter. However, in case the competent authority feels that the relief claimed by the petitioner is not admissible or made out, in that case, a speaking order be passed in the matter.
