Petitioner has preferred the instant petition under Section 438 Cr.P.C., for grant of anticipatory bail in case FIR No.15 dated 14.11.2018, registered under Sections 363 and 366 of the Indian Penal Code, at Police Station Aur, District SBS Nagar

Learned counsel for respondent No.2 has submitted that both petitioner and Parveen respondent No.3 had married on 12.11.2018.

Both Parveen Kaur and Naresh Kumar @ Ravi Kumar have sought protection from the learned District and Sessions Judge, Ludhiana, which was granted on 17.12.2018. In their absence, the mother of the prosecutrix, lodged the FIR suspecting that her daughter has been kidnapped.

Learned counsel for the petitioner as well as respondent No.2 have submitted that both are major. Even, respondent No.3-Parveen Kaur is present in the court and has submitted that she is residing happily with her husband Ravi Kumar @ Naresh Kumar.

Learned State counsel has stated that petitioner has joined the investigation; nothing is to be recovered from him and he is no more required for custodial interrogation.

In the circumstances, without going into the merits of the case, I do not deem it appropriate to deny the concession of anticipatory bail to the petitioner in the present case. Ordered accordingly.

Resultantly, the interim order dated 02.01.2019, is made absolute subject to the conditions as envisaged under Section 438(2) Cr.P.C.

Petition stands allowed.
