This writ petition under Articles 226/227 of the Constitution of India has been filed for issuance of direction to respondent Nos.1 to 5 to issue notice of meeting under Rule 10 of the Haryana Panchayati Raj Rules, 1995 read with Section 62 of the Haryana Panchayati Raj Act, 1994 for consideration of 'Motion of No Confidence' against respondent Nos. 6 and 7, who are the Chairman and Vice Chairman.

Learned counsel for the petitioner states that at this stage, he would be satisfied, if a direction is issued to respondent No. 2- Deputy Commissioner, Yamunanagar to consider and decide the reminder-cum-requisition dated 22.11.2019 (Annexure P-4) expeditiously.

Heard.

A complete set of paper book has been handed over to Mr.Vikrant Pamboo, DAG, Haryana in the Court today.

In view of the above, without adverting to the merits of the case, the present petition is disposed of with a direction to respondent No.

2- Deputy Commissioner, Yamunanagar to consider and decide the reminder-cum-requisition dated 22.11.2019 (Annexure P-4) in accordance with law within six weeks from the date of receipt of the certified copy of the judgment. In case, on consideration, the competent authority reaches to the conclusion that the benefit claimed by the petitioner is admissible to him, in such eventuality, the consequential relief be allowed to him, within a period of six weeks thereafter. However, in case the competent authority feels that the relief claimed by the petitioner is not admissible or made out, in that case, a speaking order be passed in the matter.
