The petitioner is seeking anticipatory bail in FIR No.133 dated 31.08.2019, under Sections 307, 353, 332, 186, 506, 148, 149 and 379-B of the Indian Penal Code, 1860, registered at Police Station 'A' Division, Amritsar, District Amritsar.

Learned counsel for the petitioner contends that the allegations in the FIR are that co-accused, namely, Sukhdev Singh @ Sona was selling tea and food on a cart and he had an altercation with the police officials over the payment of money. The petitioner, who was standing there along with others, is alleged to have attacked the police officials. She also contends that no specific injury is attributed to the petitioner and the main co-accused, namely, Sukhdev Singh @ Sona has been granted anticipatory bail by this Court by order dated 26.11.2019 passed in CRM-M No. 41211 of 2019. She further contends that the petitioner is an old lady of the age of 61 years.

This Court, by the order dated 28.11.2019, had directed the petitioner to appear before the Investigating/Arresting Officer and join the investigation and in the event of her arrest, she was to be released on ad-interim bail to the satisfaction of the Investigating/Arresting Officer, subject to the conditions envisaged under Section 438(2) Cr.P.C.

Learned State counsel, upon instructions from ASI Rajender Singh, states that the petitioner has joined investigation and is not required for custodial interrogation.

In view of the submissions of learned counsel for the petitioner and the petitioner having joined investigation and not required for custodial interrogation, the order dated 28.11.2019 granting interim bail to the petitioner is made absolute.

However, the petitioner shall abide by the conditions stipulated under Section 438(2) Cr.P.C. She shall also join investigation as and when called upon to do so.

The petition stands disposed of.
