Prayer in the present petition is to grant anticipatory bail to the petitioners in FIR No.212 dated 29.09.2018 registered under Sections 148, 149, 323, 324, 452, 506 of the Indian Penal Code at Police Station Sector 14, Panchkula.

On 19.12.2018, following order was passed by this Court:-

“The petitioners against whom FIR No.212 dated 29.9.2018, Police Station Sector 14, Panchkula under Sections 148, 149, 323, 324, 452, 506 and 307 of Indian Penal Code, 1860 has been lodged, are stated to be armed with a knife and a rod respectively and are alleged to have given blows with the same to the complainant. However, the learned counsel has submitted that the parties have in fact now resolved the matter, being neighbours, and a

compromise (Annexure P-2) has been effected amongst the parties and that the parties shall be filing for quashing of the petition shortly on the basis of compromise having been effected amongst the parties.

Notice of motion for 1.3.2019.

Meanwhile, in the event of arrest, the petitioner be released on interim bail subject to his furnishing personal bonds and surety bonds to the satisfaction of Arresting/Investigating Officer. However, the petitioner shall join the investigation as and when called upon to do so and shall abide by the conditions as provided under Section 438 (2) Cr.P.C.”

Learned counsel for the first informant-injured accept the settlement between the parties. It may be noted here that the parties have also filed a petition for quashing of the FIR and subsequent proceedings on the basis of compromise vide CRM-M-32479-2019.

Keeping in view the aforesaid facts, interim order dated 19.12.2018 passed by this Court is made absolute.

Accordingly, the present petition is allowed.
