Prayer in this petition is for grant of anticipatory bail in FIR No.161 dated 28.09.2019 under Sections 420 & 120-B IPC and Section 24 of Immigration Act, 1983, registered at Police Station City Khanna, District Ludhiana.

Learned counsel for the petitioner submits that as per allegations in the FIR, registered at the instance of one Gurdeep Singh, he has made a complaint against petitioner Jagjit Singh, his wife Gurpreet Kaur, his mother Sarabjeet Kaur and one Gurpreet Singh that on the pretext of sending to Canada, he was sent to Dubai and from there, his passport was taken and some blank cheques and blank papers were also got signed. It is also alleged that Rs.7,42,000/- was withdrawn from his account and an amount of Rs.17.00 lacs in cash was also taken from him.

Learned counsel for the petitioner further submits that in fact, the

petitioner has filed a complaint under Section 138 of the Negotiable Instruments Act and the same is pending before the Court and on that pretext, the FIR has been registered. It is further submitted that wife and mother of the petitioner have already been granted the concession of anticipatory bail by the Additional Sessions Judge.

After hearing learned counsel for the petitioner, considering the serious allegations against the petitioner that he has allured the complainant to part away with huge amount, out of which some amount was withdrawn from his account, for sending him to Canada and he was sent to Dubai, I find no ground to grant anticipatory bail to the petitioner.

Accordingly, the present petition is dismissed.
