ANUPINDER SINGH GREWAL, J. (ORAL)

The petitioner is seeking anticipatory bail in FIR No.151 dated 01.11.2019, under Sections 406 and 420 of the Indian Penal Code, 1860, registered at Police Station Navi Baradari, District Jalandhar.

Report of the Mediation and Conciliation Centre, Jalandhar has been received which indicates that the matter has indeed been compromised. A copy of the compromise deed is taken on record at Annexure A. In terms of the compromise, the petitioner has to pay total amount of Rs.8,35,000/- to the complainant. He has already paid a sum of Rs.2 lakh and the balance amount of Rs.6,35,000/- is to be paid to the complainant on or before 10.01.2020.

This Court, by the order dated 04.12.2019, had directed the petitioner to appear before the Investigating Officer and join the investigation and in the event of his arrest, he was to be released on ad-interim bail to the satisfaction of the Investigating/Arresting Officer,

subject to the conditions envisaged under Section 438(2) Cr.P.C.

Learned State counsel, upon instructions from ASI Hardev Singh, states that the petitioner has joined the investigation and is not required for custodial interrogation.

In view of the submissions of the learned counsel for the petitioner and the petitioner having joined investigation, the order dated 04.12.2019 granting interim bail to the petitioner is made absolute.

However, the petitioner shall abide by the conditions stipulated under Section 438(2) Cr.P.C. He shall also join investigation as and when called upon to do so. In the event of the petitioner not making the payment in terms of the compromise, it shall be open to the complainant to prefer an application in that regard.

The petition stands disposed of.
