Prayer in this petition is for grant of anticipatory bail in FIR No.0117 dated 17.11.2018 under Sections 380, 467, 468 IPC, registered at Police Station Khuian Sarwar, District Fazilka.

As per allegations in the FIR, got registered by complainant Satinderpal Singh, petitioner Armanjot Singh is his son, who is a drug addict and was married to Neeru wife of one Channan Singh about 06 months earlier and he has already been disinherited the petitioner from his property. It is further stated in the FIR that the complainant has given half portion of the house to his son and his wife by way of partition of house in panchayat. Petitioner has stolen 15-20 cheques from his HDFC Bank cheque book and by forging his signatures on Cheque No.000017, he has withdrawn Rs.36,000/- and purchased some intoxicants. Again the petitioner has stolen the cheques of the complainant, 09 tolas gold and the cheques of other persons lying in the house and has withdrawn Rs.2.00 lacs from Fazilka Bank on 30.08.2018.

On 08.01.2019, learned counsel for the petitioner had submitted that the petitioner is ready to hand over a demand draft of Rs.2.00 lacs favouring the complainant to the Investigating Officer and thereafter, the petitioner was granted interim anticipatory bail.

Learned counsel for the petitioner submits that the petitioner has never withdrawn any amount from the account of the complainant and in fact, there is a dispute regarding property between the petitioner and his father-complainant, as he wants to dispossess the petitioner from the ancestral property. It is further submitted that the petitioner has withdrawn the cheque amount from the account of the complainant only his asking.

Learned State counsel, on instructions from ASI Harjinder Singh, submits that the petitioner has neither joined the investigation nor has handed over the demand draft of Rs.2.00 lacs, as voluntarily undertaken by him on 08.01.2019.

In view of the above, present petition is dismissed.
