B.S.WALIA, J. (Oral)

1. Learned counsel for respondent Nos.2 and 3 states that the electricity connection of the tubewell supplying water to the members of the petitioner society which was disconnected on account of non-payment of electricity charges by the developer i.e. respondent No.5, has now been ordered to be restored on account of respondent no. 5 having deposited the dues with respondents Nos.2 and 3, on 09.12.2019 and that in view thereof, the writ petition has become infructuous and may be disposed of as such.

2. In view of the position as noted above, the writ petition is disposed of as not calling for any further orders. However, the petitioner society would be at liberty to take appropriate proceedings against respondent No.5, in accordance with law for the redress of its grievance in case of non-supply of water from the tubewell of which connection has been ordered to be restored by respondent Nos.2 and 3.
