It is alleged that Tejinder Kaur, wife of petitioner, has committed a fraud, in connivance with her husband (present petitioner). Due to assassination of then Prime Minister of India, after 1984 riots at New Delhi, wife of petitioner shifted to Patiala and reported that her husband has died. She obtained a flat for riot victim and also got compensation. Now, a complaint has been made that her husband was alive at that time.

The learned counsel for petitioner states that petitioner is ready to surrender his flat and return compensation.

In view of fact that fraud has been committed with Government by misusing incident of 1984 riots, there is no ground to grant anticipatory bail. Petition is thus dismissed.
