The present petition has been filed under Section 438 Code of Criminal Procedure for grant of anticipatory bail to the petitioner in case FIR No.205 dated 18.11.2018 registered for the offences punishable under Sections 498-A, 336, 323, 506 of Indian Penal Code, at Police Station City Dhuri, District Sangrur.

Heard.

Serious allegations have been levelled against the petitioner with regard to demand of dowry and causing simple hurt to the complainant and her minor child. It is specifically mentioned in the FIR that on 16.11.2018 at about 2:00 p.m., the petitioner came to the parental house of the complainant to take her back and demanded ₹ 2 lacs from the complainant and her father for purchasing a new car. However, the father of

the complainant, who is a cancer patient, refused to give the said amount, on which, the petitioner got annoyed and while returning back with the complainant and their minor child, on motorcycle, the petitioner intentionally hit his motorcycle into the pavement of the over bridge which caused injuries to the wife and the minor son. Instead of providing medical help to them, the petitioner escaped from the spot and it was the benevolence of the passers-by which called the father of the victim, who managed the first aid.

Keeping in view the above, this Court is of the view that the petitioner is not entitled to concession of anticipatory bail.

Dismissed.
