After hearing learned counsel for the parties, it has come on record that earlier CRM-M-38120-2017 was disposed of on 07.12.2017, vide which on the basis of affidavit of DSP, Sub Division Dakha, District Ludhiana (Rural) that a cancellation report was prepared on 18.11.2017 and it was presented before the Illaqa Magistrate on 22.11.2017, so, the aforesaid petition was rendered as infructuous, granting liberty to the petitioner (respondents No.4 to 7) to avail the remedy of filing a protest petition or a complaint before the competent Court, in accordance with law.

Learned counsel for the parties are ad idem that later on, an application dated 16.03.2018 was filed by the prosecution under Section 173 (8) Cr.P.C. seeking permission of the trial Court for further investigation and in the meantime, present petition was filed and it is submitted that this petition be

disposed of with a direction to the trial Court to dispose of the said application expeditiously.

In view of the above, this petition is disposed of with a direction to the trial Court to dispose of the application under Section 173 (8) Cr.P.C. expeditiously, preferably within a period of two months from today.

The parties are granted liberty to raise all the legal objections before the trial Court, in accordance with law, including an objection regarding validity of Annexure P-4.

Disposed of, accordingly.
