[1] Prayer in the writ petition is for the issuance of a writ of mandamus for directing the respondents to regularize the services of the petitioner as Class IV employee as per policy instructions (Annexures P-3 to P-5) w.e.f. the due date, when similarly situated employees, juniors to the petitioners were regularized along with all consequential benefits.

[2] Learned counsel contends that although the petitioner has served legal notice (Annexure P-10) dated 15.08.2019 in respect of the grievance, which is the subject matter of the writ petition, but no decision has been taken on the claim, till date and that in the circumstances, the petitioner would be satisfied, if the writ petition is disposed of by directing respondent No.3 to consider and decide the claim made in the legal notice (Annexure P-10) dated 15.08.2019, in accordance with law, in a time bound manner.

[3] Notice of motion.

[4] Mr. Harish Rathee, learned Senior Deputy Advocate General, Haryana, accepts notice on behalf of the respondents and states that he has no objection to the limited prayer of the petitioner.

[5] Without commenting upon the merits of the claim or the entitlement of the petitioner to the relief claimed, the writ petition is ***disposed of*** by directing respondent No.3 to consider and decide the claim made in the legal notice (Annexure P-10) dated 15.08.2019, in accordance with law and after taking into account all aspects of the matter within a period of 03 months from the date of receipt of certified copy of this order.
