Petitioners claim that they have attained majority and married against the wishes of their family members. Apprehending threat to their life and liberty, they have filed the present petition for protection.

Petitioners claim to have submitted a representation (Annexure P-5) dated 17.12.2019, in this regard, to the Senior Superintendent of Police, Tarn Taran, Punjab.

Heard. Record perused.

Notice of motion to the office of Advocate General Punjab.

On asking of the Court, Mr.Randhir Singh Thind, DAG, Punjab, present in the Court, accepts notice on behalf of the State. Copy supplied.

Petitioners have placed on record copies of their Aadhar Cards (Annexures P-1 and P-2) respectively as proof of their age as well as copy of Marriage certificate (Annexure P3) and photographs (Anneuxre P-4).

During the course of hearing, learned counsel for the petitioners submits that the Matriculation and Secondary School

Examination certificate of the girl is in the possession of her parents.

This petition is disposed of with a direction to the Senior Superintendent of Police, Tarn Taran, Punjab, to look into the representation Annexure P-5 dated 17.12.2019 and ensure that no harm is caused to the petitioners.

However, it is made clear that this order shall not be treated as stamp of the Court about the marriage of the parties and no opinion regarding the validity of the marriage has been expressed.
