2      25-06-2020                      Due to COVID-19 Pandemic, the matter is being  
taken up by way of Virtual Court proceeding.

The matter has been listed under the heading ‘For  
Orders’ under the orders of Hon’ble the Chief Justice.

Heard learned counsel for the petitioner and learned  
APP for the State.

The petitioner is apprehending his arrest in a case  
registered under Sections 307, 506, 34 of the Indian Penal Code,  
27, 35 of the Arms Act and 6 of I.T. Act.

The prosecution case, in short, is that on the pretext of  
showing superiority over persons, the accused persons fired in a  
dance party.

It has been submitted on behalf of the petitioner that  
the petitioner has got no criminal antecedent. There is no  
allegation of tampering of witnesses alleged against the



petitioner. The petitioner has falsely been implicated in the present case. The allegation against the petitioner is that he fired but the same did not hit any one. Hence, no offence under Section 307 IPC is made out.

On behalf of the State, it is submitted that the petitioner is named in the F.I.R./complaint case.

Considering the facts and circumstances of the case and also the lockdown, the petitioner above named, in the event of arrest or surrender before the learned Court below within a period of six weeks from today, be released on anticipatory bail on his personal bond to the satisfaction of learned Chief Judicial Magistrate, Bhojpur in connection with Charpokhari P.S. Case No. 191 of 2019, subject to the conditions as laid down under Section 438(2) of the Cr.P.C.

Once the normalcy is restored, the petitioner shall furnish bail bonds of Rs. 10,000/- (Rupees ten thousand) with two sureties of the like amount each within a period of seven weeks to the satisfaction of the Court concerned in connection with the aforesaid case.
