ORAL ORDER

2 12-08-2020 Filing through email of the present application has

been accepted in view of the out-break of COVID-19 Pandemic

and has been posted before me for hearing through video

conferencing.

The application is apparently not in accordance with

the provisions prescribed under the Patna High Court Rules,

which do not contemplate filing of application through email.

In spite of that, considering the extra-ordinary situation, filing of

the present application has been allowed through email.

Considering the situation prevailing, the Court has

considered, for the present, to ignore the deficiency in filing of

the application.



Heard learned counsel for the petitioner and learned Additional Public Prosecutor for the State.

The petitioner has filed the present application under Sections 439 and 440 of the Code of Criminal Procedure for grant of bail in connection with Dhoraiya P. S. Case No.232 of 2019 registered under Section 30(a) & (d) of the Bihar Prohibition and Excise Act, 2016.

Considering the period undergone by the petitioner in custody as an under trial prisoner for the alleged recovery of 10 litres of *mahua* wine from his house in his absence, he is directed to be released on bail on furnishing bail bond of Rs.10,000/- (Rupees ten thousand) with two sureties of the like amount each to the satisfaction of learned Additional Sessions Judge-II, Banka in connection with Dhoraiya P. S. Case No.232 of 2019.

Since, there is a State wide lockdown, the Court has considered it appropriate to adopt the following procedure for communication of the present order :-

- (i) The order, which has been dictated during the course of proceeding of the virtual court, shall be communicated to me on my email by the Senior Secretary.
