The petitioner has filed the present application under Sections 439 and 440 of the Code of Criminal Procedure for grant of bail in connection with Industrial Area P.S. Case No. 173 of 2019 registered under Sections 406, 420, 467, 468 and 471 read with 34 of the Indian Penal Code.

Considering the nature of the offence, the allegation made against the petitioner, the plea of innocence taken by him and the period undergone by him in custody as an under-trial prisoner, he is directed to be released on bail on furnishing bail bond of Rs.10,000/- (Rupees Ten Thousand) with two sureties of the like amount each to the satisfaction of the learned Chief Judicial Magistrate, Bhagalpur in connection with Industrial Area P.S. Case No.173 of 2019.

Since the court proceedings are being conducted through virtual mode and normal court functioning has not been restored till date, it is considered appropriate to adopt the following procedure for communication of the present order:-

- (i) The order, which has been dictated during the course of proceeding of the virtual court, shall be communicated to me on my email by the Senior Secretary.
