at Bhabua, in confiscation Case No. 254 of 2017-18
whereby vehicle, bearing Registration No. BR- 45E 8497
has been confiscated and further direction to the
respondents to release the vehicle seized in connection with
Chainpur P.S. Case No. 197 of 2017 for the offences



punishable under Section 30(a) of the Bihar Prohibition and Excise Act, 2016.

Learned counsel for the petitioner invites our attention to the order dated 18th January, 2020 passed in CWJC No. 3245 of 2017 titled as Manish Kumar Chaudhary Vs. The State of Bihar & Ors. and prays for disposal in terms thereof.
