05.01.2018 passed by the District Magistrate, Darbhanga, in
Confiscation Case No. 05 of 2018 whereby vehicle, namely,
Hero Honda Glamour Motorcycle bearing Registration No. BR-
07S-3973 has been confiscated and further direction to the
respondents to release the vehicle seized in connection with Ali



Nagar P.S. Case No. 84 of 2017 for the offences punishable under Sections 272 and 273 of the Indian Penal Code and Section 30(A) of the Bihar Prohibition and Excise Act, 2016.

Learned counsel for the petitioner invites our attention to the order dated 18th January, 2020 passed in CWJC No. 3245 of 2017 titled as Manish Kumar Chaudhary Vs. The State of Bihar & Ors. and prays for disposal in terms thereof.

As such, as prayed for, on mutually agreed terms, we dispose of the present petition in terms of the order dated 18th January, 2020 passed in CWJC No. 3245 of 2017 titled as Manish Kumar Chaudhary Vs. The State of Bihar & Ors. making the terms contained therein, applicable mutatis mutandis, insofar as applicable, also to the instant petition. The terms of the said order shall be deemed to have been incorporated and read as a part and parcel of the present order.
