The present writ petition has been filed for “issuance of an appropriate writ/s order/orders, direction/directions commanding the respondents to provide the amount towards gratuity and leave encashment to the petitioner who were under deputation under the Respondent-Corporation and subsequently they were returned to the parent Department (Bihar State Handloom & Handicrafts Corporation Ltd.), the period of deputation of the petitioner was 04.07.2017 to 29.12.2017, for which interest thereon; or any other relief or reliefs to which the petitioner is entitled to.”
