ORAL ORDER

(Per: HONOURABLE THE CHIEF JUSTICE)

2 06-01-2020 The petition filed on 25.06.2018 is listed for hearing
for the first time today before the Court.

Heard learned counsel for the petitioner and learned
counsel for the respondents.

Petitioner has prayed for the following relief:

“(i) For issuance of an appropriate writ, order or
direction commanding the respondent-authorities to
take appropriate legal action against the Respondent
No. 6 who is surviving in the Government job on the
basis of fake and fabricated certificates.



(ii) For issuance of an appropriate writ order or direction against the Respondent No. 6 to recover the entire amount being already paid and being paid and as such misusing the public money.

(iii) For issuance of an appropriate writ, order or direction commanding the respondents to restrict the Respondent No. 6 from service as Dafadar in Ayer Police Station, District- Bhojpur.”

After the matter was heard for some time, learned counsel for the petitioner submits that petitioner shall be content if a direction is issued to the concerned respondents to consider and decide the representation, which the petitioner shall be making afresh within a period of four weeks from today.

Learned counsel for the State states that upon receipt of such request, if any, the same shall be dealt with in accordance with law, expeditiously and positively within a period of three months from the date of receipt thereof.

Equally, liberty is reserved to the petitioner to take recourse to such alternative remedies as are otherwise available in accordance with law.

We are hopeful that as and when petitioner takes recourse to such remedies, as are otherwise available in law, before the appropriate forum, the same shall be dealt with, in accordance with law and with reasonable dispatch.



The petition stands disposed of in the aforesaid terms.
