3 06-03-2020 Heard learned counsel for the petitioner and learned
APP for the State.

2. The petitioner apprehends his arrest for the offences
alleged under Sections 323, 498A and 494 of the Indian Penal
Code registered in connection with Complaint Case No. 1045C of
2018.

3. It is submitted that the petitioner has been falsely
implicated and the accusation of demand of dowry and inflicting
cruelty are denied. In any event, the dispute between the parties
has now been mutually amicably settled, after which the
petitioner and the opposite party no. 2 are living together
harmoniously. The petitioner claims clean antecedents.

4. Learned counsel for the opposite party no. 2 accepts



the submission of learned counsel for the petitioner.

5. Be that as it may, in the event of the petitioner's arrest or surrender before the court below within six weeks from the date of communication of this order, let the above named petitioner be released on bail on furnishing bail bond of Rs.10,000/- (ten thousand) with two sureties of like amount each to the satisfaction of Miss. S. Kujoor, learned Judicial Magistrate 1st Class, Khagaria in connection with Complaint Case No. 1045C of 2018, subject to the conditions as laid down under Section 438 (2) Cr.P.C., and also subject to the following further conditions -

(i) That one of the bailors shall be a close relative of the petitioner.

(ii) That the petitioner shall not indulge in any similar offence till conclusion of the trial.

(iii) That the petitioner shall remain physically present in Court on each and every date during trial and in the event of failure on two consecutive dates without sufficient reason, his bail bond shall be liable to be cancelled by the learned Court concerned.
