2 08-01-2020 The petition filed on 04.01.2020 is listed for hearing
for the first time today before the Court.

Heard learned counsel for the petitioner and learned
counsel for the respondents.

Petitioner has prayed for the following reliefs:

“(i) For direction to respondent to remove the encroachment from Khata No. 97, Khesra No. 160, Area 12-14-17 situate at Mauza Sukulwa Khurd P.S. +District Gopalganj in respect of which there is an specific order of the First Appellate Authority dated 20.04.2019 (Annexure-2).

(ii) For direction to the Additional District Magistrate (Respondent No. 3) to cancel Jamabadi No. 104 with respect to land bearing Khata No. 97, Mauza Sukulwa Khurd Thana No. 56 which is gairmajarua Aam Land and in respect of which the Circle Officer Thawey to cancel the aforesaid



Jamabandi.”

After the matter was heard for some time, learned counsel for the petitioner submits that petitioner shall be content if a direction is issued to the concerned respondents to consider and decide the representation, which the petitioner shall be making afresh within a period of four weeks from today.

Learned counsel for the State states that upon receipt of such request, if any, the same shall be dealt with in accordance with law, expeditiously and positively within a period of three months from the date of receipt thereof.

Equally, liberty is reserved to the petitioner to take recourse to such alternative remedies as are otherwise available in accordance with law.

We are hopeful that as and when petitioner takes recourse to such remedies, as are otherwise available in law, before the appropriate forum, the same shall be dealt with, in accordance with law and with reasonable dispatch.

The petition stands disposed of in the aforesaid terms.
