4 20-10-2020 The present petition has been taken up for consideration through the mode of Video Conferencing in view of the prevailing situation on account of COVID-19 Pandemic.

The learned counsel for the petitioner fairly submits that the grievances of the petitioner has stood redressed, hence the petitioner does not wish to press the present writ petition, however he it is stated that the petitioner be granted liberty to agitate his grievances regarding payment of interest on account of delayed payment of retiral benefits.

Having regard to the submissions made by the learned
