**CRM 2862 of 2020

In Re: An application for anticipatory bail under Section 438 of the Code of Criminal Procedure in connection with Bagnan P.S. Case No. 34 of 2018 dated 02.02.2018 under Sections 147/148/149/326/307/353/186/34/332/427/379/506/325 of the Indian Penal Code and Sections 3/4 of the Explosive Substance Act and Section 3 of the Prevention of Damage to Public Property Act.

Heard learned lawyers for the parties.

It is contended on behalf of the petitioners that a commotion occurred in the locality and petitioners have been falsely implicated in the instant case.

Keeping in mind the nature of allegations and extent of complicity of the petitioners, we are inclined in granting anticipatory bail to the petitioners.

Accordingly, we direct that in the event of arrest, the petitioners be released on bail upon furnishing a bond of Rs.10,000/- (Rupees Ten Thousand Only) each, with two sureties of like amount each, to the satisfaction of the arresting officer and also subject to the conditions as laid down under Section 438(2) of the Code of Criminal Procedure.

The application for anticipatory bail is, thus, allowed.
