1. The limited grievance that the Petitioner has raised in this case is that the Petitioner had made certain deposits in the Respondent No.3 - Society under various schemes and heads, however, subsequently, the Respondent No.3 - Society has been closed and at the instance of Respondent No.1 a Liquidator was also appointed i.e. Respondent No.4.
2. Learned Counsel for Petitioner submits that meanwhile the deposits of other creditors were released; however, the deposits made by the Petitioner were not released. Petitioner makes a limited prayer that let the Respondents No. 1 and 4 take a decision on the claim application of the Petitioner seeking for release of the amount lying deposited with Respondent No.3 - Society.
3. The limited prayer made by the Petitioner is not opposed by the learned Counsel appearing for Respondents No. 1 and 4.

4. Accordingly, Respondents No. 1 and 4 are directed to take a decision on the application which the Petitioner has filed seeking for release of the amount which is lying with Respondent No.3 - Society which was deposited by the Petitioner under different schemes and heads. It is expected that the authorities would take a decision at the earliest, preferably within a period of sixty days from the date of receipt of copy of this order, purely in accordance with the rules and guidelines governing the field.

5. Writ Petition accordingly stands disposed of with the aforesaid direction.
