Hon'ble Smt. Justice Rajani Dubey**Order on Board****14.01.2020**

1. The accused/applicant has moved this first bail application under Section 439 of Criminal Procedure Code for releasing him on regular bail during trial in connection with Crime No. 234/2018 registered at Police Station- Nandini, District- Durg (C.G.) for the offence punishable under Sections 11 (1), 2 (च), 4, 6, 10 of the Chhattisgarh Krishak Pashu Parirakshan Adhiniyam.
2. The prosecution story, in brief is that, on 08.09.2018, the police has recovered 14 numbers of the cattle from the vehicle bearing Truck No.M.H.-27, X-7644 without given the food to said cattle, the applicant was taking all the cattle to the slaughter house. Thereafter, offence has been registered against the present applicant.
3. Learned counsel for the applicant submits that the applicant is innocent and has been falsely implicated in the crime in question. He further submits that the offence has been triable by the Judicial Magistrate First Class. The applicant is in jail since 30.10.2019, there is no likelihood of his case being decided in near future,

therefore, the present applicant may be released on bail.

4. On the other hand, counsel for the State opposes the bail application.
5. I have heard learned counsel for the parties and perused the case diary.
6. Taking into consideration the nature and gravity of the offence, facts and circumstances of the case, and further considering the facts that the offence has been triable by the Judicial Magistrate First Class. The applicant is in jail since 30.10.2019 and the trial is likely to take some time for its final disposal, this Court is of the view that it is a fit case to release the applicant on bail. Accordingly, the application is allowed.
7. Accused/applicant is directed to be released on bail on his executing a personal bond in the sum of Rs. 25,000/-, with one local surety in the like sum to the satisfaction of the trial Court. He is directed to appear before the trial Court on each and every date given to him by the said Court.
