ORAL ORDER :

Smt. Seema T. Pawar, learned counsel holding for Shri A.G. Talhar, learned counsel for respondents No.2 and 3 submitted before this Court that the order of this Court is duly complied with and the petitioner also accepted the fact of due compliance of the order.
