1. The petition is under Section 29-A of the Arbitration and Conciliation Act 1996. Disputes arose between the parties under an Agreement for Restructuring of debts dated 20th February 2014. By an order dated 26th July 2018, an advocate of this Court was appointed as the sole arbitrator. The arbitrator entered upon the reference to his arbitration shortly thereafter, and the matter proceeded before him.
