ORDER

(The case has been heard through video conference)

The petitioners, who apprehend arrest at the hands of the respondent police for the alleged offences **under Sections 4294(b), 324, 506(ii) of IPC, in Crime No.528 of 2020** on the file of the respondent police, seek anticipatory bail.

2. The case of the prosecution as per the de-facto complainant viz. Natarajan is that due to previous enmity, the petitioners have waylaid him and attacked the defacto complainant, abused him in filthy language and also threatened him with dire consequences,

3. The learned counsel for the petitioners would submit that the petitioners are innocent and they have been falsely implicated in this case due to previous enmity. Therefore, he prays to grant anticipatory bail to the petitioners.

4. The learned Additional Public Prosecutor would submit that due to previous enmity, the accused persons have waylaid the defacto complaint and attacked him, abused him in filthy language and also threatened him with dire consequences. He would further submit that it is a case in counter, and the counter case has been registered in Crime No.529 of 2020. He would further submit that the injured has been discharged from the hospital.

5. Taking into consideration of the facts and circumstances of the case and also the submissions made by the learned counsels and also considering the fact that the injured has been discharged from the hospital, this Court is inclined to grant anticipatory bail to the petitioners, subject to the following conditions:

a) Accordingly, the petitioners are ordered to be released on bail, in the event of arrest or on their appearance, within a period of fifteen days from the date on which the order copy was made ready, before the **learned Judicial Magistrate No.II, Mannargudi**. on condition that the petitioners shall execute a separate bond for a sum of Rs.10,000/- (Rupees ten thousand only) with two sureties, for a like sum to the satisfaction of the respondent police or the police officer who intends to arrest or to the satisfaction of the learned Magistrate concerned, failing which, the petition for anticipatory bail shall stand dismissed and on further condition that:

[b] the sureties shall affix their photographs and Left Thumb Impression in the surety bond and the Magistrate may obtain a copy of their Aadhar card or Bank pass Book to ensure their identity.

[c] the petitioners shall report before the respondent police daily at 5.30 p.m until further orders.

[d] the petitioners shall not tamper with evidence or witness either during investigation or trial.

[e] the petitioners shall not abscond either during investigation or trial.

[f] On breach of any of the aforesaid conditions, the learned Magistrate/Trial Court is entitled to take appropriate action against the petitioners in accordance with law as if the conditions have been imposed and the petitioners released on bail by the learned Magistrate/Trial Court himself as laid down by the Hon'ble Supreme Court in **P.K.Shaji vs. State of Kerala [(2005)AIR SCW 5560]**.

[g] If the accused thereafter absconds, a fresh FIR can be registered under Section 229A IPC.

6.With the above directions, this Criminal Original Petition is ordered.
