PETITION FOR ANTICIPATORY BAIL Under Sec.438 of Cr.P.C

PRAYER :-

for Anticipatory bail in Crime No. 197 of 2020 on the file of the respondent police

ORDER : The Court made the following order :-

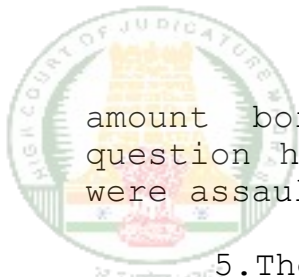
Heard the learned counsel appearing for the petitioners and the learned Government Advocate(Crl. Side) appearing for the respondent.

2. The petitioners apprehending arrest at the hands of the respondent police for the offences punishable under sections 147, 148, 323, 342, 364A, 394, 506(ii) of I.P.C., in Crime No.197 of 2020 on the file of the respondent police, seek anticipatory bail.

3. The learned Government Advocate opposes the grant of relief by pointing out the number of cases in which the petitioners have been implicated.

4. I went through the contents of the First Information Report. It appears that since the defacto complainant did not return the

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amount borrowed from the first petitioner, the occurrence in question had taken place. The defacto complainant and his friend were assaulted but they did not suffer any serious injury.

5. Therefore, I am inclined to grant anticipatory bail to the petitioners with certain conditions. Accordingly, petitioners are ordered to be released on bail in the event of arrest or on their appearance before the learned Judicial Magistrate No.VI, Madurai, and on their executing a bond for a sum of Rs.10,000/- (Rupees Ten thousand only) with two sureties each for a like sum to the satisfaction of the learned Magistrate concerned and on further condition that the petitioner shall appear before the respondent police as and when required for interrogation. The petitioners shall comply with the conditions stipulated under Section 438 Cr.P.C scrupulously.

6. The petitioners shall appear before the concerned Magistrate within a period of 15 days from the date on which the order copy made ready, failing which, the petition for anticipatory bail shall stand dismissed.
