PETITION FOR ANTICIPATORY BAIL Under Sec.438 of Cr.P.C

PRAYER :-

for Anticipatory bail in Crime No.24 of 2020 on the file of the respondent police

ORDER : The Court made the following order :-

Heard the learned counsel appearing for the petitioners and the learned Government Advocate(Crl. Side) appearing for the respondent.

2. The petitioners apprehending arrest at the hands of the respondent police for the offences punishable under sections 147, 148, 342, 323, 302 and 109 of I.P.C., in Crime No.24 of 2020 on the file of the respondent police, seek anticipatory bail.

3. The case of the prosecution is that the deceased Muthiah and the accused Paulraj contested in the local body elections and that Al-Paulraj through one Rajendran paid a sum of Rs.15,000/- to the deceased to withdraw from the race and to work for him. But Al lost



in the election. Therefore, A1 wanted the money back. This is said to be the reason for the occurrence.

4. Three of the accused have been arrested. There are no serious allegations against the petitioners. Therefore, the arrest is not going to advance the cause of investigation.

5. In the view of the above, I am inclined to grant anticipatory bail to the petitioners with certain conditions. Accordingly, petitioners are ordered to be released on bail in the event of arrest or on their appearance before the learned Judicial Magistrate No.II, Usilampatti, Madurai District, and on their executing a bond for a sum of Rs.10,000/- (Rupees Ten thousand only) with two sureties each for a like sum to the satisfaction of the learned Magistrate concerned and on further condition that the petitioner shall appear before the respondent police daily at 10.30 a.m., till all the accused in this case are either arrested or granted relief in any other manner and thereafter, as and when required for interrogation. The petitioners shall comply with the conditions stipulated under Section 438 Cr.P.C scrupulously.

6. The petitioners shall appear before the concerned Magistrate within a period of 15 days from the date on which the order copy made ready, failing which, the petition for anticipatory bail shall stand dismissed.
