PETITION FOR BAIL Under Sec.439 of Cr.P.C.

PRAYER :-

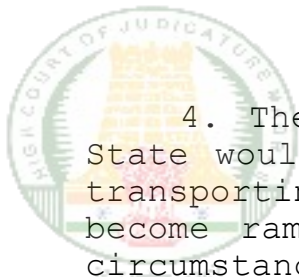
for bail in Crime No. 44 of 2020 on the file of the respondent police

ORDER : The Court made the following order :-

This petition has been filed by the petitioner/ accused seeking bail for the alleged offence punishable under Sections 379 of IPC r/w. 21(1) Mines and Minerals (Development and Regulation) Act, 1957

2. The case of the prosecution is that the petitioner was illicitly transporting $\frac{1}{4}$ unit of river sand was apprehended along with bullock cart.

3. The petitioner was in incarceration from 12.02.2020. Being the first time offender he seeks bail since he is in jail for the past 35 days.



4. The learned Additional Public Prosecutor appearing for the State would submit that the petitioner was caught red handed while transporting river sand illegally. Since illicit sand mining has become rampant in Thanjavur District, taking note of the factual circumstances the learned Sessions Judge had dismissed the petition. This Court also dismissed the bail petition on 05.03.2020. There is no change in the facts and circumstances of the case to entertain the petition.

5. Taking note of the period of incarceration and the submission made by the learned Additional Public Prosecutor this Court is inclined to grant bail to the petitioner by imposing conditions.

6. Accordingly, the petitioner is ordered to be released on bail on his executing a bond for a sum of Rs.1,00,000/- (Rupees One lakh only) with two sureties each for a like sum to the satisfaction of the learned Judicial Magistrate cum Munsif, Papanasam;

[a] the sureties shall affix their photographs and left thumb impression in the surety bond and the Magistrate/concerned court may obtain a copy of their Aadhar card or Bank Pass Book to ensure their identity;

[b] the petitioner shall deposit a sum of Rs.20,000/- (Rupees Twenty thousand only) to the credit of Crime No.44 of 2020 before the learned Judicial Magistrate cum Munsif, Papanasam, without prejudice his defence before the trial Court;

[c] the petitioner shall report before the respondent police as and when required for interrogation.

[d] the petitioner shall not abscond either during investigation or trial.

[e] the petitioner shall not tamper with evidence or witness either during investigation or trial.

[f] On breach of any of the aforesaid conditions, the learned Magistrate/Trial Court is entitled to take appropriate action against the petitioner in accordance with law as if the conditions have been imposed and the petitioner released on bail by the learned Magistrate/Trial Court himself as laid down by the Hon'ble Supreme Court in P.K.Shaji vs. State of Kerala [(2005)AIR SCW 5560].

[g] If the accused thereafter absconds, a fresh FIR can be registered under Section 229A IPC.

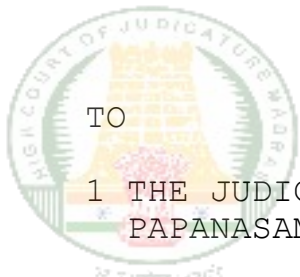
