PETITION FOR ANTICIPATORY BAIL Under Sec.438 of Cr.P.C

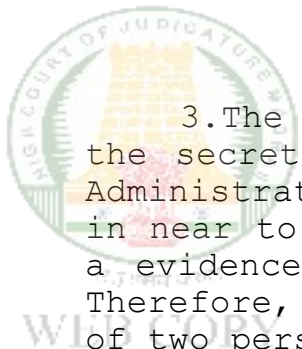
PRAYER :-

For Anticipatory Bail in Crime No.360/2020 on the file of the Respondent police.

ORDER : The Court made the following order :-

Heard the learned counsel appearing for the petitioner and the learned Additional Public Prosecutor appearing for the respondent.

2. The petitioner apprehending arrest at the hands of the respondent police for the offences punishable under section 379 of I.P.C., and Section 21(1) of Mines and Minerals (Development & Regulation) Act, 1957 in Crime No. 360 of 2020 on the file of the respondent police, seeks anticipatory bail.



3.The case of the prosecution is that on 06.06.2020, based on the secret information, the defacto complainant, namely the Village Administrative Officer and the village headman went to surveillance in near to village kanmoi. At that time, they found that there was a evidence in the Kanmoi for the illegal transportation of sand. Therefore, they searched in nearby areas, they found that in outside of two persons' house, the sand was heaped. Hence, a complaint.

4.The learned counsel appearing for the petitioner would submit that the petitioner is an innocent and he did not commit any offence as alleged by the prosecution. He would further submit that the petitioner has been falsely implicated in this case. Further, the learned counsel, on instructions from the petitioner, would submit that without any prejudice to his rights and contentions, the petitioner is ready to pay a sum of Rs.10,000/- (Rupees Ten Thousand Only), as non-refundable compensation, by way of Demand Draft, in favour of 'The Dean, Government Hospital, Ramanathapuram', for the purpose of providing facilities to the Health workers.

5.The learned Additional Public Prosecutor appearing for the State, on instructions, would submit that there is no previous case pending against the petitioner.

6.Considering the facts and circumstances of the case and also considering the fact that the petitioner is ready to pay a sum of Rs.10,000/- to the Government Hospital, Ramanathapuram, this Court is inclined to grant anticipatory bail to the petitioner on certain conditions:-

(i) Accordingly, the petitioner is ordered to be released on bail in the event of arrest or on his appearance before the learned Judicial Magistrate, Mudukulathur and on his executing a bond for a sum of Rs.10,000/- (Rupees Ten thousand only) with two sureties each for a like sum to the satisfaction of the learned Magistrate concerned;

(ii)The petitioner is directed to pay a sum of Rs.10,000/- (Rupees Ten Thousand Only), by way of Demand Draft, in favour of 'The Dean, Government Hospital, Ramanathapuram', on or before 07.07.2020, for the purpose of providing facilities to the Health workers, as non-refundable compensation, without prejudice his rights, since the Health workers put their lives at risk every day and play a critical role in preventing the spread of COVID-19 Pandemic, failing which anticipatory bail granted to the petitioner shall stand cancelled automatically;

(iii) The petitioner shall appear before the respondent police daily at 10.00 a.m., for a period of two weeks and thereafter, as and when required, for interrogation.

Magistrate/ Trial Court is entitled to take appropriate action against the petitioner in accordance with law as if the conditions have been imposed and the petitioner released on bail by the learned Magistrate/Trial Court himself as laid down by the Hon'ble Supreme Court in ***P.K.Shaji Vs. State of Kerala [(2005) AIR SCW 5560]***; and

(v) If the accused thereafter absconds, a fresh FIR can be registered under Section 229-A IPC.

7. The petitioner shall appear before the concerned Magistrate within a period of 15 days from the date on which the order copy made ready, failing which, the petition for anticipatory bail shall stand dismissed.

8. The petitioner shall comply with the conditions stipulated under Section 438 Cr.P.C scrupulously.
