PETITION FOR ANTICIPATORY BAIL Under Sec.438 of Cr.P.C

PRAYER :-

For Anticipatory Bail in Crime No.1796 of 2020 on the file of the Respondent Police.

ORDER : The Court made the following order :-

The petitioners, who are arrayed as A1 to A5 and A11, apprehending arrest at the hands of the respondent police for the offences punishable under sections 147, 294(b), 323, 324 and 506 (ii) of IPC and Section 4 of the Tamil Nadu Prohibition of Women Harassment Act, in Crime No.1796 of 2020 on the file of the respondent police, seek anticipatory bail.



2.The case of the prosecution is that the petitioners and the defacto complainant are neighbours. Due to dispute regarding parking of a dog, the petitioners and other accused were said to have trespassed into the house of the defacto complainant and abused using filthy language and also attacked him with hands. Hence, the complaint.

3.Heard the learned counsel appearing for the petitioners and the learned Government Advocate (Crl. Side) appearing for the respondent.

4.The learned counsel appearing for the petitioners submitted that the petitioners are innocent persons and they have been falsely implicated in this case. He further submitted that the injured person has already been discharged from the hospital. He further submitted that already co-accused have been released on anticipatory bail by this Court in Crl.O.P(MD).No.7365 of 2020, dated 20.07.2020. Hence, he seek anticipatory bail.

5.The learned Government Advocate (Crl. Side), on instructions, submitted that the injured person has already been discharged from the hospital.

6.Considering the fact and circumstances of the case and considering the fact that the injured person has already been discharged from the hospital and co-accused have been released on anticipatory bail, this Court is inclined to grant anticipatory bail to the petitioners with certain conditions.

7.Accordingly, the petitioners are ordered to be released on bail in the event of arrest or their appearance, within a period of four weeks from the date of receipt of a copy of this order, before the Additional Mahila Court, Madurai, on condition that the petitioners shall execute a bond for a sum of Rs.50,000/- (Rupees Fifty thousand only)each with two sureties each for a like sum to the satisfaction of the respondent Police or to the Police Officer, who intends to arrest or to the satisfaction of the learned Magistrate concerned and on further condition that:

(a)the petitioners and the sureties shall affix their photographs and left thumb impression in the surety bond and the Magistrate may obtain a copy of their Aadhar card or Bank pass Book to ensure their identity;

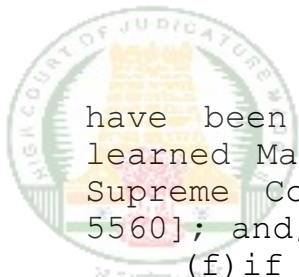
(b)the petitioners shall report before the respondent police as and when required for interrogation.

(c)the petitioners shall not tamper with evidence or witness either during investigation or trial;

(d)the petitioners shall not abscond either during investigation or trial;

(e)on breach of any of the aforesaid conditions, the learned Magistrate/ Trial Court is entitled to take appropriate action

have been imposed and the petitioners released on bail by the learned Magistrate/Trial Court himself as laid down by the Hon'ble Supreme Court in P.K.Shaji Vs. State of Kerala [(2005) AIR SCW 5560]; and;

(f) if the accused/petitioners thereafter abscond, a fresh FIR can be registered under Section 229-A IPC.
