PETITION FOR ANTICIPATORY BAIL Under Sec.438 of Cr.P.C

PRAYER :-

For Anticipatory Bail in Crime No.73 of 2020 on the file of the Respondent Police

ORDER : The Court made the following order :-

The petitioner who arrayed as A-3 apprehending arrest at the hands of the respondent police for the offences punishable under sections 420, 468, 471, 120B, 294(b) and 506(2) of I.P.C., in Crime No.73 of 2020 on the file of the respondent police, seeks anticipatory bail.

2. The case of the prosecution is that the petitioner is grandson of A-1. An ancestral property originally belongs to the defacto complainant. The allegation is that without the knowledge of the defacto complaint, the ancestral property Patta has been transferred to A-1 and thereafter, the Patta has also been



transferred to this petitioner. Hence, the complaint.

3. Heard the learned counsel appearing for the petitioner and the learned Government Advocate (criminal side) appearing for the respondent.

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4. The learned counsel appearing for the petitioner submitted that the petitioner is an innocent person and he has been falsely implicated in this case. He further submitted that the defacto complainant has approached the Revenue Divisional officer to cancel the Patta. Hence, he seeks anticipatory bail.

5. The learned Government Advocate (criminal side), on instructions, submitted that civil dispute is pending between the parties. He further submitted that now the Patta was also transferred in the name of the Defacto complainant.

6. Considering the fact and circumstances of the case and submission made by the learned Government Advocate (criminal side), this Court is inclined to grant anticipatory bail to the petitioner with certain conditions.

7. Accordingly, the petitioner is ordered to be released on bail in the event of arrest or on his appearance before the learned Judicial Magistrate, Melur, and on his executing a bond for a sum of Rs.25,000/- (Rupees Twenty Five Thousand only) with two sureties each for a like sum to the satisfaction of the learned Magistrate concerned and on further condition that,

(a) the petitioner and the sureties shall affix their photographs and left thumb impression in the surety bond and the Magistrate may obtain a copy of their Aadhar card or Bank pass Book to ensure their identity;

(b) the petitioner shall report before the respondent police as on when required for interrogation.

(c) the petitioner shall not tamper with evidence or witness either during investigation or trial;

(d) the petitioner shall not abscond either during investigation or trial;

(e) on breach of any of the aforesaid conditions, the learned Magistrate/ Trial Court is entitled to take appropriate action against the petitioner in accordance with law as if the conditions have been imposed and the petitioner released on bail by the learned Magistrate/Trial Court himself as laid down by the Hon'ble Supreme Court in P.K.Shaji Vs. State of Kerala [(2005) AIR SCW 5560]; and;



(f) if the accused thereafter absconds, a fresh FIR can be registered under Section 229-A IPC.
