PETITION FOR ANTICIPATORY BAIL Under Sec.438 of Cr.P.C

PRAYER :-

For Anticipatory Bail in Crime No.2098 of 2020 on the file of the Respondent Police

ORDER : The Court made the following order :-

The petitioner, who is the sole accused, apprehending arrest at the hands of the respondent police for the offences punishable under sections 448, 427 and 380 of IPC, in Crime No.2098 of 2020 on the file of the respondent police, seeks anticipatory bail.

2.The petitioner is the brother-in-law of the defacto complainant. The case of the prosecution is that earlier the defacto complainant got married the sister of the petitioner, it is an inter-caste marriage, which was objected by the petitioner and a complaint has been given against the defacto complainant. Since the defacto complainant and the petitioner's sister are majors, the said complaint has been closed. Now, due to that enmity, the petitioner said to have trespassed in to the house of the defacto complainant and stolen household articles. Hence, the present complaint.



3. Heard the learned counsel appearing for the petitioner and the learned Government Advocate (Criminal Side) appearing for the respondent.

4. The learned counsel appearing for the petitioner submitted that the petitioner is an innocent person and he has not committed any offence as alleged by the prosecution. He further submitted that due to previous enmity, the petitioner has been falsely implicated in this case. Hence, he prayed for grant of anticipatory bail to the petitioner.

5. The learned Government Advocate (Criminal Side) appearing for the respondent Police submitted that due to previous enmity, the petitioner said to have trespassed into the house of the defacto complainant and stolen TV and other household articles. Hence, the crime has been registered.

6. Considering the facts and circumstances of the case and also considering the fact that due to previous enmity with regard to intercaste marriage, the occurrence said to have taken place and the stolen properties were recovered from the petitioner, I am inclined to grant anticipatory bail to the petitioner with certain conditions.

7. Accordingly, the petitioner is ordered to be released on bail in the event of arrest or his appearance, within a period of four weeks from the date of receipt of a copy of this order, before the learned Judicial Magistrate No.VI, Trichy, on condition that the petitioner shall execute a bond for a sum of Rs.25,000/- (Rupees Twenty Five thousand only) with two sureties each for a like sum to the satisfaction of the respondent Police or to the Police Officer, who intends to arrest or to the satisfaction of the learned Magistrate concerned and on further condition that:

(a) the petitioner and the sureties shall affix their photographs and left thumb impression in the surety bond and the Magistrate may obtain a copy of their Aadhar card or Bank pass Book to ensure their identity;

(b) the petitioner shall report before the respondent police as and when required for interrogation.

(c) the petitioner shall not tamper with evidence or witness either during investigation or trial;

(d) the petitioner shall not abscond either during investigation or trial;

(e) on breach of any of the aforesaid conditions, the learned Magistrate is entitled to take appropriate action



against the petitioner in accordance with law as if the conditions have been imposed and the petitioner released on bail by the learned Magistrate/Trial Court himself as laid down by the Hon'ble Supreme Court in P.K.Shaji Vs. State of Kerala [(2005) AIR SCW 5560]; and;

(f) if the accused/petitioner thereafter absconds, a fresh FIR can be registered under Section 229-A IPC.
