PETITION FOR ANTICIPATORY BAIL Under Sec.438 of Cr.P.C

PRAYER :-For Anticipatory bail in Crime No. 105 of 2020 on the file of the respondent police

ORDER : The Court made the following order :-

The petitioners, who are arrayed as A-1 to A-6 apprehending arrest at the hands of the respondent police for the offences punishable under Sections 147, 294(b), 336, 324, 506(ii), 379 of IPC and Section 4 of Tamil Nadu Prohibition of Harassment of Women Act, in Crime No.105 of 2020, seek anticipatory bail.

2. The case of the prosecution is that due to previous enmity between the petitioners and the defacto complainant, the petitioners said to have abused the defacto complainant using filthy language



and assaulted her with stone and wooden stick and also snatched her chain of five sovereigns and also criminally intimidated her. Hence, the complaint.

3. Heard the learned counsel appearing for the petitioners and the learned Government Advocate (Crl. Side) appearing for the respondent.

4. The learned counsel appearing for the petitioners submitted that the petitioners are innocent persons and they have been falsely implicated in this case. He further submitted that the defacto complainant and the petitioners are relatives and this is case in counter. He would further submit that due to previous enmity between the parties a false complaint has been preferred by the defacto complainant. Hence, he seek anticipatory bail.

5. The learned Government Advocate (Crl. Side), on instructions, submitted that this is a case in counter and the injured person has already been discharged from the hospital.

6. Considering the fact and circumstances of the case and considering the fact that this is case in counter and the injured person has already been discharged from the hospital, this Court is inclined to grant anticipatory bail to the petitioners with certain conditions.

7. Accordingly, the petitioners are ordered to be released on bail in the event of arrest or their appearance, within a period of four weeks from the date of receipt of a copy of this order, before the learned District Munsif Cum Judicial Magistrate, Thiruppuvanam, on condition that the petitioners shall execute a bond for a sum of Rs.50,000/- (Rupees Fifty thousand only) with **common surety** for a like sum to the satisfaction of the respondent Police or to the Police Officer, who intends to arrest or to the satisfaction of the learned Magistrate concerned and on further condition that:

(a) the petitioners and the sureties shall affix their photographs and left thumb impression in the surety bond and the Magistrate may obtain a copy of their Aadhar card or Bank pass Book to ensure their identity;

(b) the petitioners shall report before the respondent police as and when required for interrogation.

(c) the petitioners shall not tamper with evidence or witness either during investigation or trial;

(d) the petitioners shall not abscond either during investigation or trial;



(e) on breach of any of the aforesaid conditions, the learned Magistrate/ Trial Court is entitled to take appropriate action against the petitioners in accordance with law as if the conditions have been imposed and the petitioners released on bail by the learned Magistrate/Trial Court himself as laid down by the Hon'ble Supreme Court in P.K.Shaji Vs. State of Kerala [(2005) AIR SCW 5560]; and

(f) if the accused/petitioners thereafter abscond, a fresh FIR can be registered under Section 229-A IPC.
