PRAYER: Writ Petition filed under Article 226 of the Constitution of India for issuance of Writ of Mandamus, directing the 4th respondent to issue 'No Objection Certificate' to the petitioner for enabling him to apply under Departmental Quota in the Recruitment of Sub-Inspector of Police, (Taluk, Armed Reserve and Tamil Nadu Special Police-2019) on or before 19.04.2019.

O R D E R

The petitioner's candidature, being a departmental candidate, came to be rejected on the ground that certain charges were pending against him as on the date of the notification for the



post of Sub Inspector of Police.

2. The notification issued by Tamil Nadu Uniformed Services Recruitment Board in No.2 of 2019, dated 08.03.2019, prescribes the eligibility criteria for the departmental quota candidates as 20% and one of the conditions required for applying under the departmental quota is that, the candidates should have a clean record without any punishment other than minor punishments of black mark, reprimand and censure in their entire service.

3. In the instant case, the petitioner herein was imposed with the punishment of postponement of next increment for a period of three years with cumulative effect, vide proceedings dated 09.01.2017 and on appeal, the period was modified from three years to one year. As such, the petitioner may not be qualified to seek for 20% quota for departmental candidates.

4. In view of the above facts and circumstances, I do not find any reason to direct the second respondent to issue 'No Objection Certificate' in favour of the petitioner. Accordingly, the Writ Petition stands dismissed. However, there shall be no order as to costs.
