PETITION FOR ANTICIPATORY BAIL Under Sec.438 of Cr.P.C

PRAYER :-

For Anticipatory Bail in Crime No.1 of 2020 on the file of the Respondent Police.

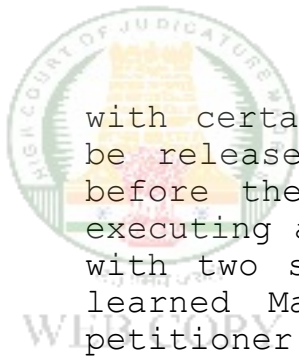
ORDER : The Court made the following order :-

Heard the learned counsel appearing for the petitioner and the learned Government Advocate(Crl. Side) appearing for the respondent.

2. The petitioner apprehending arrest at the hands of the respondent police for the offences punishable under sections 408, 420, 468, 471, 477A, 120B of I.P.C., in Crime No.1 of 2020 on the file of the respondent police, seeks anticipatory bail.

3.This Court directed the petitioner to appear before the respondent. Accordingly, the petitioner appeared before the respondent and she had also been interrogated. The case against the petitioner appears to be that there was a lapse in overseeing.

4.I am of the view that the arrest of the petitioner is not warranted. The petitioner is based in Chennai and she is a lady. Since the arrest of the petitioner is not going to serve any purpose, I am inclined to grant anticipatory bail to the petitioner



with certain conditions. Accordingly, the petitioner is ordered to be released on bail in the event of arrest or on her appearance before the learned Judicial Magistrate No.1, Madurai, and on her executing a bond for a sum of Rs.10,000/- (Rupees Ten thousand only) with two sureties each for a like sum to the satisfaction of the learned Magistrate concerned and on further condition that the petitioner shall appear before the respondent police as and when required for interrogation. The petitioner shall comply with the conditions stipulated under Section 438 Cr.P.C scrupulously.

5. The petitioner shall appear before the concerned Magistrate within a period of 15 days from the date on which the order copy made ready, failing which, the petition for anticipatory bail shall stand dismissed.
