COMMON ORDER

The present petitions have been filed to quash the First Information Report registered in Crime No.94 of 2014, dated 26.03.2014, on the file of the first respondent.

Today, when the petitions were taken up for hearing, the learned Government Advocate (Criminal side) appearing for the first respondent as well as the learned counsel appearing for the second respondent in both the petitions submitted that now, the investigation in Crime No.94 of 2014 has been completed and final



report has also been laid by the first respondent and the concerned Jurisdictional Magistrate is yet to take cognizance of the offence.

3. Considering the fact that the investigation in Crime No.94 of 2014 has been completed and final report has also been filed, I find no reason to quash the First Information Report at this stage and hence, the Criminal Original Petitions are dismissed. However, after taking cognizance of the offence, if the petitioners have any grievance, it is always open to them to challenge the same in the manner known to law. Consequently, the connected miscellaneous petitions are closed.
