The petitioner has filed present petition under Section 439 of the Code of Criminal Procedure, 1973 for grant of regular bail to him in case FIR No.683 dated 22.10.2019 registered under Sections 148, 149, 323, 506 of the Indian Penal Code, 1860 and Sections 25, 54 of the Arms Act, 1959 at Police Station Camp Palwal, District Palwal to which Sections 324 and 326 of the IPC were added lateron.

I have heard learned Counsel for the petitioner and learned State Counsel and gone through the relevant record.

Learned Counsel for the petitioner has argued that the petitioner has been falsely implicated in the case. Grievous injury caused with sharp edged weapon attracting Section 326 of the IPC is attributed to the petitioner. The petitioner is in custody since 22.11.2019. The trial is likely to take long time. No useful purpose will be served by detention of the petitioner in custody during trial. Therefore, the petitioner may be granted regular bail.

On the other hand, learned State Counsel has argued that the petitioner having committed heinous offence does not deserve the concession of regular bail. Therefore, the petition may be dismissed.

Keeping in view the facts and circumstances of the case, nature of accusation and evidence collected against the petitioner, the fact that the grievous injury caused with sharp edged weapon is not attributed to the petitioner and that trial is likely to take long time but without commenting on the merits of the case, I am of the considered view that the petitioner deserves the concession of regular bail.

Therefore, the petition is allowed and the petitioner is ordered to be released on regular bail on furnishing of bail bonds to the satisfaction of the trial Court/Chief Judicial Magistrate, Palwal.
